With the draft Legal Aid, Sentencing and Punishment of Offenders Bill and White Paper now out, pressure continues to build on Ken Clarke's intended reforms. The recent u-turns will make it more difficult to give reality to his bold intentions to reduce the numbers in prison, but there remains much in the White Paper which we commend and hope to build on.

Make Justice Work has responded robustly to some of the unhelpful media coverage. At the same time we are working hard to ensure that much better use is made of robust community sentences for lower level offenders.

National Commission of Enquiry

Our final enquiry, focusing on mental health, was held in London on 11th July. Thanks to the generosity of the City Bridge Trust, the event was held in grand setting of the Livery Hall at the Guildhall.

Lord Bradley gave the opening speech at the afternoon session, and there was a lively and informative debate in which the audience of over 130 people took an active part.

We are now writing the final report which will be launched in September and discussed at a series of roundtable seminars at the Party Conferences.
